- Techniques for converting colour images to black and white
- Exporting images for print and display using slideshows and web galleries

Requirements

Participants are expected to bring a digital SLR camera capable of shooting images in raw format. Bringing your own laptop computer is desirable but not essential. Prior experience with Photoshop Lightroom is not required.
